Answerable to the Prime Minister, the Employment Advisory Council is an advisory body on all employment issues. Created by an Order of 7 April 2005, the Council was established by the Prime Minister on 6 October 2005. It is a permanent body with 50 members, including, in addition to its Chairman and Vice-Chairman, representatives of the social partners, members of the National Assembly and Senate, local authority representatives, heads of the relevant government departments and public bodies, and experts on labour and employment issues.
